



# Classification of CP Subtypes

<b>SCPE Classification of CP Subtypes</b> based on the predominant neurological findings		All CP subtypes have in common an abnormal pattern of movement and posture. <b>Additional features by subtype:</b>
<b>SPASTIC CP</b>	<b>Bilateral Spastic (BS-CP)</b>	Increased tone Pathological reflexes - increased reflexes, e.g. hyperreflexia - pyramidal signs, e.g. Babinski response resulting in abnormal pattern of movement and posture
	<b>Unilateral Spastic (hemiplegia)</b>	
<b>DYSKINETIC CP</b>	<b>Dystonic</b>	Involuntary, uncontrolled, recurring, occasionally stereotyped movements, primitive reflexe patterns predominate, muscle tone is varying
	<b>Choreo-athetotic</b>	
<b>ATAXIC CP</b>		Loss of orderly muscular coordination, so that movements are performed with abnormal force, rhythm and accuracy
